


". . . A TIME FOR SOLITUDE . . . "








"... A TIME FOR PEACE ..."



Dedication—a by-word at Messick for sixty years—has brought her from a small county school to a complex structure worth over one million dollars, whose influence continues to live in the achievements of graduates in all areas of life. Located at what was then called Buntyn, Tennessee, the present elementary building was erected in 1908 to encompass the elementary schools of Buntyn, Fleece Station, and Avlon. Miss Elizabeth Messick, then County Superintendent of Schools for whom the school is named, was criticized for spend-




ing \$30,000 of the taxpayers' money for a building which would "never be filled!" Several years ago the new gym alone cost \$300,000 and corridors and rooms of the school throng with students.

Built to do away with the little one room, many graded school, Messick was the first consolidated high school in Shelby County and probably in the South. Small truck farms covered the surrounding areas now occupied by modern townhouses and neat homes. Those living too far to walk to school were brought in wagonettes. To provide their children with hot lunches, the Messick mothers brought food which they had cooked at home. Their efforts helped launch the first school cafeteria system in this section of the state. In contrast to the well-stocked library shelves available to pupils today, early Messick students found selections quite limited. Three hundred books were bought by the county board, put in thirty lock boxes with ten selected volumes in each box, and were shared by all the schools. A box could stay at a school for one month. Study hall was then located on the third floor of the elementary building as was the office.

No institution can be stronger than the people who organize and run it, and Messick owes much to those who have







given of themselves through the years to make it an influential force.

Though she was never directly associated with the school, Miss Elizabeth Messick was responsible for its founding, and because of her intelligent reforms in the school system, for its potential for continued growth, Miss Messick showed an early interest in education. At sixteen she went to Chicago after hearing that John D. Rockefeller had given some millions to establish a new university. The school had not been completed and she had difficulty finding anyone who had ever heard of it. She finally located the president and became the first student to enroll in the University of Chicago. After her graduation from


college, she taught for three years and was then made County Superintendent of Schools although she was only 27. She served four years, resigning the year Messick was built to marry Elmer E. Houk, city editor of the COMMER-CIAL APPEAL.

Messick's first principal was Miss Daisy Porter, who was followed by Miss Rubie Batte. Miss Batte exercised fine abilities for fourteen years to give the school an excellent foundation. Succeeding her were Miss Nina Rickman and Mr. Ernest C. Ball, who was later Superintendent of the Memphis City Schools. During Mr. Ball's administration, the school was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and by the State Department of Education. Mr. Fred S. Elliot and Miss Sarah Fletcher followed Mr. Ball. In 1930 Messick became a city school and Mr. T. H. Grinter took the post as principal which he was to hold until his death 23 years later. Mr. Grinter gave the motto now used in the school seal: "We do as we please, because we please to do right," One beloved name at Messick was that of Miss Anne Hunt. Miss Hunt served as a teacher, assistant principal and acting principal over a period of thirty-five years. She was assistant principal twenty-eight years under six different principals before her retirement. Mr. Shelby Counce held the position as principal from 1953 to 1957 when he left to take a position at the Memphis Board of Education. Mrs. Lottye McCall served as assistant principal under him and has continued in the position under the present principal, Mr. Radford W. Rosebrough. Mrs. McCall's many years of devoted service to Messick include also 32 years as a teacher. From a background rich with tradition, Messick continues to grow in influence.

Memphis State, where he earned his M.A., and the University of Tennessee where he did his graduate work.

His activities include membership in the Lion Club, membership in MEA, WTEA, and AASA.

For forty-seven years Mrs. Lottye K. McCall has devotedly served Messick. During these years she has taught English, coached basketball, instructed students in the basics of speech, debate, and eventually was appointed Assistant Principal, an office which she still holds. Mrs. McCall's many activities include the office of state president and international vicepresident of Delta Kappa Gamma Society and various other offices in several other professional organizations. She also has the distinction of being listed in both "Who's Who in American Women" and "Who's Who in American Education." She is an honorary colonel in Messick's ROTC program and established Messick's NFL chapter in 1934. Her outstanding character and her influence in both the school and the community will not be forgotten. A mere "thank-you" for her years of service would be inadequate.

Distinguished Service

Memphis Coach Merits Distinguished Service Key

Mrs. Lottye K. McCall of Messick High School in the city of Memphis, Tenn., has really put the Tennessee district on the N. F.L. map. Starting with the first debate class to meet at Messick High School in the spring of 1934 she has built a speech program for the school which in itself is outstanding, but she has also served the District by directing its program.

The local program of speech at Messick includes all phases of contest speaking from debate through oratorical declamation and after-dinner speaking. In tournaments including the state or a larger area, seven wins in debate, four wins in extempore speech, firsts in original oratory for both boys and girls, firsts in different kinds of declamation and honors in the Student Congresses are among the outstanding honors won. In city-wide and other local tournaments, Messick speakers win with surprising regularity.

In the service of her district, Mrs. McCall was elected assistant District Chairman the first year after organizing NFL in her school. Through this office she helped sponsor the first NFL tournament for the district. Two times district chairman and each

year on the staff of district tournament managers has helped keep the NFL tournament an annual affair in the district.

A loyal supporter of National Tournaments, her school was represented each year since 1934 with the exception of May, 1935.

The supporter of this well-rounded program states that she believes very strongly in contest work, because it furnishes an incentive for polished work that nothing else can. To have succeeded in bringing students to the front each year is proof enough that contest work does bring success to speakers.



MATHEMATICS WAS HER strongest interest and Miss Hodges was always associated with it in her career at Messick. Displays of geometric figures were frequently found on her desk.






WORKING TO KEEP our lunchroom and school in excellent shape are Mrs. Burlison, Mrs. Chambers, and Mr. Fox.








































